This awareness fueled my passion to acquire the skills necessary to transform healthcare outcomes for children in the region.

My commitment to this field led me to enroll in the COSECSA training program at Coast General Teaching and Referral Hospital (CGTRH) in 2016 and Gertrude's Children's Hospital in 2024, where I am a pioneering female paediatric surgical resident now in my final year. Despite facing challenges, including the need to shift to the MMed program at the University of Nairobi to gain paediatric surgical expertise, my determination has never wavered.

My vision extends beyond personal achievement; I aim to establish a Paediatric Surgery Fellowship program at CGTRH, ensuring that future surgical residents have the opportunity to specialize without having to leave their communities. My dedication to mentoring and developing a network of professionals in paediatric surgery will undoubtedly elevate the standards of care in the Region.

COSECSA has developed a decentralized surgical training programme with a common examination, leading to an Internationally recognized surgical qualification at both membership and fellowship levels.

MEMBERSHIP COLLEGE OF SURGEONS (MCS)

Basic Surgery

2 Years

A certificate of competence in surgery at General Medical Officer Grade (2 years) training). After two years, trainees should be able to take responsibility for emergency surgical admissions, deal with life-threatening situations resulting from trauma or critical illness and be able to diagnose and plan treatment for a variety of common surgical conditions.

The Membership Examination is designed to assess the basic principles of surgery and a broad knowledge of surgery in general. It is designed to identify surgical trainees who can recognize and deal with the wide variety of problems that may be met by trainees. They should be able to take responsibility for emergency surgical admissions, deal independently with life threatening situations due to trauma or critical illness, and be able to diagnose and plan treatment of a wide variety of surgical complaints.

Membership of the College does not confer specialist status but signifies that the member is ready to pursue higher surgical training in a particular specialty. Higher surgical training in the chosen specialty is examined by the College's Fellowship Examination, which will confer specialist status.

It offers a comprehensive curriculum that spans various disciplines, both general and specialized surgery with benefits of hands-on training in clinical settings as well as theoretical knowledge under the mentorship of experienced surgeons. The program also encourages research to advance surgical techniques and delivery. With an internationally recognized qualification, graduates are held to the highest standards of surgical practice. Additionally, the emphasis on continuous learning fosters professional development and prepares fellows for leadership roles in healthcare.

Graduating with the FCS qualification signifies a commitment to surgical excellence and a dedication to improving patient outcomes in the region.

- a) Ensure to read the Programme Regulations and Syllabus thoroughly before applying.
- b) All applicants **MUST** submit an application online at https://bit.ly/47bcU4p. Remember to meet all the requirements including Certified & Nortarized copies of all your transcripts and all certificates. Detailed information can be obtained from; https://bit.ly/3MjqlqZ
- c) Only applications the meet all the Criteria will be considered for approval.
- d) Upon approval of your application, a non-refundable Programme Entry fee of USD 500 (five hundred U.S. Dollars) for MCS and USD 600 (six hundred U.S. Dollars) is to be paid to COSECSA. Details will be obtained from the secretariat
- e) Applicants having difficulties with their application can contact applications@cosecsa.org

The deadline for submitting an online application for new intake are:

- ⇒ MCS 31st October each year.
- ⇒ FCS 31st December each year.

Requirements:

- Applicants are required to contact their respective Country's COSECSA Country Representative (CR) before applying for COSECSA training.
- Applicants must attached the following PDF documents when applying:
 - ⇒ A passport photo & copy of the Birth Certificate/National Identity.
 - ⇒ A scanned image of your medical degree & medical registration certificate. (Certified)
 - ⇒ If applicable, applicants must submit a copy of any surgical qualifications that they have; such as MCS or MMED.
 - ⇒ Your application will not be considered if you do not have/submit the above requirements

Membership of College of Surgeons (MCS)

For those enrolling to the MCS programme, please follow the general instructions.

Requirements:

Fellowship of College of Surgeons (FCS)

- For current trainees progressing from MCS to FCS
 Applicants for the FCS programmes should be able to show that they have passed the MCS examination not more than 3 years before applying to the FCS Programme.
- 2. Applicants who possess an MMED in Surgery and would like to register for FCS in the same specialty (Example MMED in General Surgery and want to apply for FCS General Surgery)

Applicants with MMed (Surgery) qualification, may register to sit the FCS exam in the year following their completion of MMed training. On condition that this year is spent in an accredited COSECSA training programme in that specialty.

- 3. Applicants who possess the MMED in Surgery and would like to register for training in a different specialty (Example MMED in General Surgery but wants to specialize in Orthopaedics)
 - Applicant with the above criteria MUST register for the full FCS training course.
- 4. For the FCS Paediatric Orthopaedic Surgery programme, an applicant MUST have an FCS Orthopaedics/ MMED-Orthopaedics or equivalent qualifications.
- 5. For the FCS Cardiothoracic Surgery Programme, an applicant MUST have an FCS General Surgery/ MMED-General Surgery or equivalent qualification.

Established in 1978, ECAJS is a quarterly, peer-reviewed, open-access publication of the COSECSA.

Its aim is to advance the science of surgery and surgical care while facilitating the exchange of ideas among surgeons and surgical care researchers in the COSECSA region. With a total of 29 volumes with approximately 60 issues and over 1000 articles, the journal runs on a diamond open-access publication model ensuring free and increased access to published content at zero costs to authors and readers alike.

The ECAJS is indexed in several databases, including African Journals Online (AJOL), African Index Medicus, EBSCO, ASCI, Bioline International, Crossref, ROAD, Global Health, CAB Abstracts, FATCAT, ZDB, Wikidata, SUDOC, and OPENALEX.

Led by the Editor-in-Chief Prof. Abebe Bekele, the team is supported by 6 deputy editors and a richly diverse editorial board, with representation from around the globe.


